## Success Story: 800 W Broadway, Minneapolis, MN

Sunrise provided financing for Sherman Associates' 800 W Broadway project in one of the most distressed areas of Minneapolis. The project is transforming a vacant, blighted urban building into a mixed-used facility which will not only create jobs, but also provide critical services to a community comprised of 85% minority residents and with a 52.5% poverty rate. The space will be rehabilitated into office and retail space and will house a Workforce Center, Minneapolis Public Schools, NorthPoint Health, and retail spaces. The overall mission of the project is to increase the community's access to employment, education, and health care.
